Use of Nationally agreed target

 Nationwide percentage target for solid waste diversion per Philippine Development Plan 2017-2022 in the absence of SDG 12.5 target



Audit During COVID-19 Pandemic

- Changes in audit procedures due to travel restrictions and alternative work arrangements
- Use of online platforms for meetings
- Uploading of data on online repositories such as Google Drive
- Conduct of fieldwork validation and inspection when travel restriction eased up in mid-2022

Key Audit Findings

 Inconsistent implementation of waste segregation and waste diversion, wherein significant presence of mixed wastes were found in landfills

- Insufficient waste facilities and landfills to service the LGUs and barangays nationwide
- Non-establishment of the Solid Waste Management Fund intended to fund the approved the SWM plans of LGUs



Key Audit Findings

- Gaps in program implementation due to absence of the absence of the National Ecology Center for 20 years
- Fragmentations in the program implementation



Key Audit Findings

 Nationally agreed target of Percent of Solid Waste Diversion vs. status of SDG 12.5

No. of Barangays Nationwide	42,046
Agency-funded MRFs	1,840
Operational MRFs	63.64%
Operational MRFs with Complete Data	40.76%







DENR funded MRFs account for only 17% of total MRFs nationwide
