










Progress in the Achievement of the Goals of the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act Needs Stronger Support and the Cohesive Efforts and Strategies of All Stakeholders



Audit Findings Related to Achievement of SDGs

- Solid waste generation is continually increasing and is projected to increase further in future years
- Insufficient number of MRFs to service barangays for waste diversion
- Insufficient number of SLFs to service LGUs for proper waste disposal
- Mandated closure, transition, and prohibition of dumpsites not met
- RCAs have potential risks if operated longer than intended
- Delay in LGUs' implementation of 10-year SWM plans
- Waste diversion accomplishments were far from targets
- Lack of recording mechanism in MRFs resulting in unreliable and incomplete data on waste diversion
- SDG 12.5 is not yet tracked by the government
